

Dušan Mramor is Full Professor of Finance at the Faculty of Economics, University of Ljubljana.

In the field of higher education he was the Dean of the Faculty of Economics (2007-2013), the Chairman of the Board of University of Ljubljana (2000-2002 and 2009-2013) and Associate Dean of the Faculty of Economics (1997-2001), Recurring Visiting Professor at the Central European University in Budapest, Hungary, and Research Associate and Visiting Scholar at the School of Business, Indiana University, USA.

Dr. Mramor had an active role in the Slovenian transition process, serving as Minister of Finance of the Republic of Slovenia (2002 – 2004), member of the council of the National Bank of Slovenia, member of the Admission Board of the Ljubljana Stock Exchange, first Chairman of the Securities Market Agency of Slovenia (5 years), advisor to the Minister of Finance, member of the Strategic Economic Council of the Prime Minister of Slovenia and member of the Advisory Board of the President of Slovenia. He also served as a Vice President of the Development Committee - advisory committee of the Prime Minister of Slovenia (2013-2014). In the period 2014-2016 he served for the second time as Minister of Finance of Republic of Slovenia. For his contribution to the revival of Slovenian economy he was granted the award of European Finance Minister of the Year 2016 by The Banker.

He also served as a member of the supervisory board of Abanka Bank, vice president of the board of SKB bank, World Bank consultant, a member of the Slovenian Accounting Standards Board and consultant to the government of Slovenia and a number of firms and banks.

Most of his research is in the broad area of transition finance and economics, more specifically in Financial Markets, Financial Analysis, Corporate Finance, Business Valuation, and Fiscal and Monetary Policy. He is the author of three books on Corporate Finance, editor of several books on Capital Markets and Corporate Finance, and author or coauthor of more than 30 larger research studies. His articles were published mainly in international journals and in books focusing on topics in transition finance and economics, but also in journals such as Expert Systems with Applications, Journal of Business Venturing, and International Review of Financial Analysis.

He was vice president of the European Finance Association. Currently he is a member of the editorial board of Economic and Business Review and associate editor of Journal of Economics and Business. He has been invited to give numerous lectures at universities and government institutions in Europe, the U.S. and Asia. He also served as Vice-president of the board of European Institute for Advanced Studies in Management (EIASM) and of European Finance Association (EFA), member of Initial Accreditation Committee and European Advisory Committee of AACSB and a member of International Advisory Committee of Maastricht University School of Business and Economics. He was serving as chairman or member on the numerous peer review teams for EQUIS or AACSB accreditations and as a mentor to schools seeking initial AACSB accreditation. Currently he is the member of International Advisory Board of Hanken School of Economics.
