## Conference

On **February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2020**, the conference **Deviating from Absolute Priority** will be held, organised by **ACLE** research members Prof. Enrico Perotti and Prof. Rolef de Weijs. It will focus on the major revision of the insolvency procedures by the EU Preventive Restructuring Directive: the shift towards reorganisation procedures away from liquidation procedures and the issue of how to deal with priority issues. Debates will be held by legal scholars, economists and policy makers. Speakers will e.g. include Prof. Douglas G. Baird (Chicago Law School), Jonathan M. Seymour, JD (Duke University School of Law) and Giorgia Piacentino, PhD (Columbia Business School).

#### 1<sup>st</sup> ACLE co-funded PhD Position

In September, UvA's Master in Law & Finance top-5 graduate <u>Maryam Malakotipour</u> started as the ACLE's first co-funded PhD candidate under Prof. Enrico Perotti's (Amsterdam Business School) and Prof. Rolef de Weijs' (Amsterdam Law School) supervision. This project is co-funded by the Centre for the Study of European Contract Law (<u>CSECL</u>) and the <u>UvA Finance Group</u>. Her PhD research topic is *Contracting out of the Shadow of Bankruptcy Law: Does allowing for a further contractualisation of insolvency law impact business funding and financial stability?*
